New Library Catalog in 2017

In January the library is launching a new catalog that will improve how materials may be browsed, searched and discovered. The new catalog will go live on Thursday, January 12.

Saturday, January 7 will be the last day to place holds, renew materials online, apply for a library card or update your patron record. **Beginning Monday**, **January 9 through Wednesday**, **January 11 patrons** will be able to only check out books.

The new catalog will have a user-friendly interface and navigating through databases will be easier. New features include: responsive design optimized for smartphones and tablets, options to receive text/email notices, and the ability to record your reading history.

While the library staff works to ensure a smooth transition, the effort is not without challenges. Your PIN number will change to reflect the last four digits of your current telephone number on your patron record. Personal saved lists of reading lists from our current system will not migrate to the new system. If you would like to keep a record of your past reading history, please print out your current "reading history" before January 12.

Now is the time to call or visit us online to update information on your patron record. As always, if you have questions, any library staff at all public desks may help you with this transition.
