## Automatic renewal to debut November 20

Starting, Monday, November 20, eligible library items will renew automatically, giving you more peace of mind as well as more time with your library materials.

So, what do you need to do to enjoy this new service? Nothing. Beginning November 20, eligible items will automatically renew when they become due. You don't need to do anything --it's automatic!

Items not eligible for automatic renewal are DVDs, Book Express, materials with holds placed on it, items that have exceeded renewals, blocked accounts or if the cardholder has fines of \$10 or more.

Cardholders who have an email address listed on their account will get an email letting them know which items were automatically renewed, and which were not. Cardholders can sign up for email notifications by asking a staff member in person at the library, by phone or logging into their account using the "My Account" tab on the website.

# How to register for a program offered at the library

Registration can be done a variety of ways.

- Online: Visit the library's web-page, [www.crownpointlibrary.org](http://www.crownpointlibrary.org), and click on the tab labeled "EVENTS". Once you are on the EVENTS page, click on the green calendar of events box on the right margin. Once you reach the calendar, locate the date of the program you'd like to attend, and click on it. Click on the button, "Register Now" and enter your information. You may select to have a reminder email sent to you prior to the event.

- Crown Point programs: For adult programs call the CP Reference Desk at 306-4593 or visit the Reference Desk on the 2nd floor and they can register you for any class(s) you would like to attend.

- For children's programs call the CP Children's Library at 306-8068 or visit the Children's Service Desk on the 2nd floor and they can register you for any class(s) you would like to attend.

- Winfield Library programs: Call 662-4039 or visit the Circulation Desk at Winfield Branch Library to register for programs for all ages.

\*Important: If an event is full, please place yourself on the waiting list when available. Sometimes the library can meet demand with an additional class or may have a cancellation. Other times the library may plan a future event and use the waiting list to alert people of the new event. Be thoughtful of others and cancel your registration if you realize you are unable to come to class.

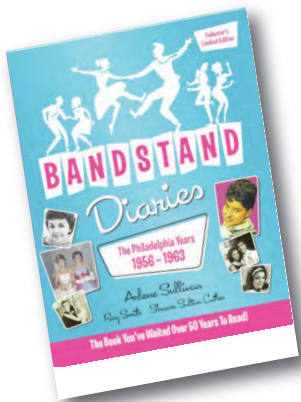

In the late 1950s and early 1960s, it was a weekday tradition for over 20 million teenagers and pre-teens to rush home from school to watch Dick Clark's American Bandstand on their black-and-white television sets. The main attraction for most fans was watching their contemporaries - Philadelphia teenagers age 14 to 18- dance to pre-recorded rock 'n' roll music from the top 40 hits.

**BANDSTAND DIARIES; The Philadelphia Years 1956 to 1963**  
is the first book to focus on these amateur dancers, known as the Regulars.

## Resources for Preschoolers

The Crown Point Community Library provides a wide variety of resources to prepare children for school readiness including a fun and exciting reading program called "1,000 Books Before Kindergarten."

The reading program is designed for children ages 0-5 years, it was developed to increase awareness of the importance of reading to very young children, as well as to inspire parents to embrace their role as their child's first teacher.

The concept is simple, the rewards are priceless. The 1,000 Books before Kindergarten program encourages families to read at least 1,000 books to their preschooler before they enter school. Does it sound hard? Not really if you think about it. If you read just one book a night, you will have read about 365 books in a year. That is 730 books in two years and 1,095 books in three years. If you consider that most children start kindergarten at around five years of age, you have more time than you think.

Families can sign up anytime they visit the Crown Point and Winfield Branch libraries. Each child will receive a reading log to record the books they read. Each time a goal of recording 100 books is reached, children are encouraged to bring their log to the library to receive the next reading log and receive a special reward!

The goal of this project is to help kids enter school ready to learn. Reading is one of the most important things you can do to ensure your child's success when they begin school. It also provides an opportunity to increase their exposure to a wide variety of books, and to promote use of the library – a gold mine of free material available to all community members. In addition, the bond shared between caregiver and child when reading helps to promote a lifelong love of reading.

### LIBRARY CARDS:

Parents/Guardians who are residents of Center and Winfield Townships may apply for a free library card for children 17 & younger. Reciprocal cards are also available for non-residents with a home library card in good standing.
