Click on the button, "Register Now" and enter your information. You may select to have a reminder email sent to you prior to the event.

For children's programs call the CP Children's Library at 306-8068 or visit the Children's Service Desk on the 2nd floor and they can register you for any class(s) you would like to attend.

• Winfield Library programs: Call 662-4039 or visit the Circulation Desk at Winfield Branch Library to register for programs for all ages.

*Important: If an event is full, please place yourself on the waiting list when available. Sometimes the library can meet demand with an additional class or may have a cancellation. Other times the library may plan a future event and use the waitlist to alert people of the new event. David Clark will present a multimedia exploration of the architecture of Chicago as it celebrates its 180th Birthday of becoming a city. This program highlights the builders who created the architectural vistas seen by millions of visitors to Chicago throughout the city's history.

We concentrate on the structures seen along Jackson Boulevard from its time as a central thoroughfare for railroad era travelers through its designation as Route 66 Included are views and discussions of W. W. Boyington's Grand Pacific and Stratford Hotels, William Le Baron Jenney's Fair Store, the Rookery and Monadnock buildings of Burnham and Root, and the Marquette Building of Holabird and Roche. The information and images in this program are based upon an award-winning series of articles that has appeared in the quarterly publication of the National Historic Route 66 Federation since 2007.
