Library turns another page with new director



The Crown Point Community Library Board of Trustees is delighted to announce the appointment of Julie Wendorf as the new Director of the Library. Wendorf, a staff member since 2010, has been instrumental in expanding literacy and programming since becoming the full-time Programming & Outreach Librarian in 2015. Please join us in congratulating Wendorf on her latest appointment. A public welcoming reception will be scheduled in April during National Library Week, date to be announced.

Library Awarded \$10,000 American Dream Literacy Grant

The Crown Point Community Library (CPCL) has been selected as one of 20 public libraries nationwide to receive a \$10,000 grant, which will be used to expand the literary services currently offered at the Conlon Community Literacy Center (CCLC) and to create a new English as a Second Language (ESL) program.

The grant is the American Dream Literacy Initiative from the American Library Association (ALA), funded by the Dollar General Literacy Foundation. Eighty-five public libraries applied for the twenty available grants.

The CCLC provided a new home for the Crown Point Adult Learning Center (CPALC) in January 2017. The program, in a more visible location, benefits from the dedicated, literacy-rich, rent-free, central, and accessible space in the library. Since the relocation, it

has experienced immense growth of students.

The CPALC provides English as a Second Language (ESL) and High School Equivalency (HSE) classes four days a week. The CPALC staff and program is funded through the Indiana Department of Workforce Development and receives supplementary support from the Friends of the Crown Point Adult Learning Center (FCPALC). The CPALC is the only location offering ESL, HSE, ABE, and job training programs in one location in the Crown Point community and surrounding area. As a result, they attract students from inside and outside the Crown Point community.

Geographically, the library serves a community larger than its service area by providing an attractive reciprocal membership providing the same benefits as resident membership. Many users out-

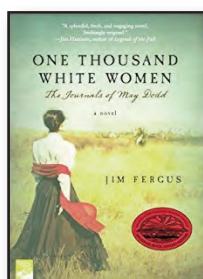
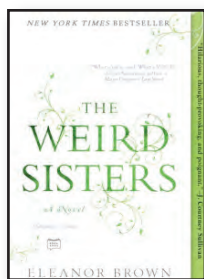

GRANT cont. side the service area use the library as a resource. "Our community is expanding and changing rapidly in its demographics and we have seen an increase in requests for English Language Learning materials from immigrants," said Julie Wendorf.

The grant funds would be used to purchase the following ESL educational support items:

- Create Language Lab: Laptops, headphones, related software and database(s)
- Update existing teacher-selected curriculum and instructional aids for ESL/HSE classes
- Purchase new curriculum and instructional aids for conversational English classes
- Develop/implement a new Volunteer Tutor Training for the CPALC's volunteers, conducting one-on-one tutoring for ESL/HSE
- Replace/augment the library's ESL and HSE materials in all formats (print, AV, digital)
- Create a library professional collection of literacy books
- Purchase Hi/Low book sets used for Literacy Center instructional use, ESL conversational classes, and recreational book club use

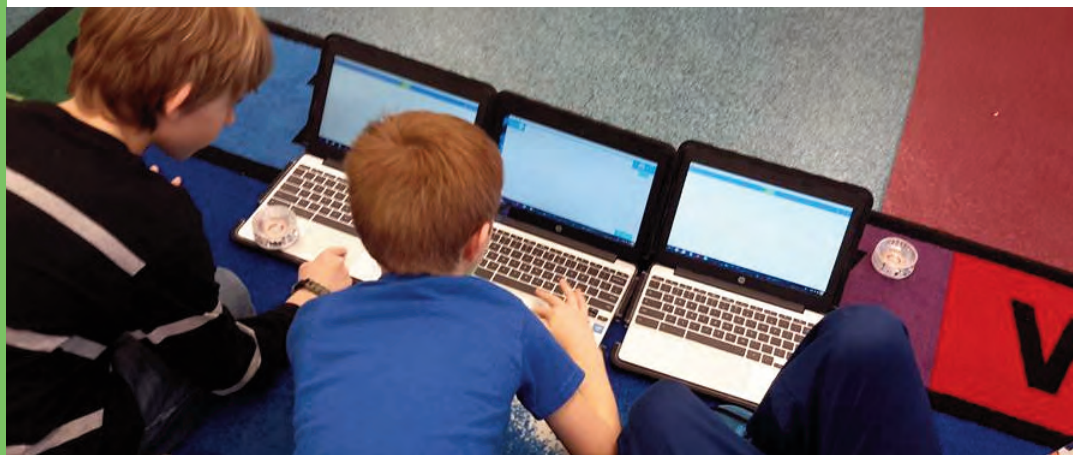
