Whiting, Indiana - Saturday, August 27, 1955 – Sunrise, 6:11 a.m. It's 80 degrees in the shade, and most of the city's residents are still trying to sleep off an airless, oppressive night. But inside the plant at Whiting's biggest employer (and one of the world's largest oil refineries), something has gone horribly wrong...something that threatens to destroy the entire community. The clock changes. 6:12 a.m.

This is the story of what happened at one minute after sunrise on that cataclysmic day in 1955, spoken in the words of the people who lived through it. It's the story of how, in the passing of a single instant, their lives and their community were changed forever.

For over 30 years, the Friend's mission has been to enhance and promote the use and enjoyment of the library. They raise funds to support library programs, services and to help fund items not generally covered in the library's regular operating budget.

The Literary Luncheon is just one of the many ways the Friends raise funds to support the Library and to provide intimate interactions between community members and quality authors and programs.
