CIVIL RIGHTS AND BACKLASH: AN URBAN/SUBURBAN MAKEOVER IN NORTHWEST INDIANA Wednesday, September 4 | 5:30 p.m.

Presented by Allison Schuette & Liz Wuerffel, Valparaiso University Free | Registration encouraged



In 1960, 180,000 people lived in Gary, Indiana, a thriving industrial city. Fifty years later, only 80,000 people lived there. Why? What happened? And where did residents go? This 90-minute interactive workshop weaves together oral histories from residents of northwest Indiana and places them alongside historical contexts to document the changing racial and economic demographics of Gary and the Region, including the rise of black political power and opportunity in the 1960s and '70s, the "flight" of white residents and

businesses to the suburbs, and the automation and subsequent underemployment of the steel mills. Though about Gary and northwest Indiana, the presentation offers a useful framework for thinking about how these dynamics played out in other cities and regions.

INDIANA ROOM

Indiana Room Specialist, Jeanene Letcher, has been working with other professionals on a Region-wide, multi-site, multi-year exhibit promoting the Calumet area. Site one, which just opened at the Visitor Information Center for the Historic Pullman Foundation and National Park Service, features the south Cook County and Illinois areas of the Calumet



region. Illinois museums and libraries have put together the first exhibit that will be on display until November 17, 2019. Letcher, along with other Lake County curators and librarians, will be organizing and finalizing the second site this fall, opening at Gary Public Library and Cultural Center in January 2020. The second site will feature Lake County's contributions to the Calumet region. Subsequent locations will be the Brauer Museum of Art at Valparaiso University and the Field Museum in Chicago. Look for exhibit information about the Lake County site opening in a future newsletter.

Gary, Indiana: The Town that Knew Me When will be on display starting mid-August and will feature a brief history of the City of Gary. The display compliments the upcoming program

Civil Rights and Backlash: An Urban/Suburban Makeover in Northwest Indiana.
