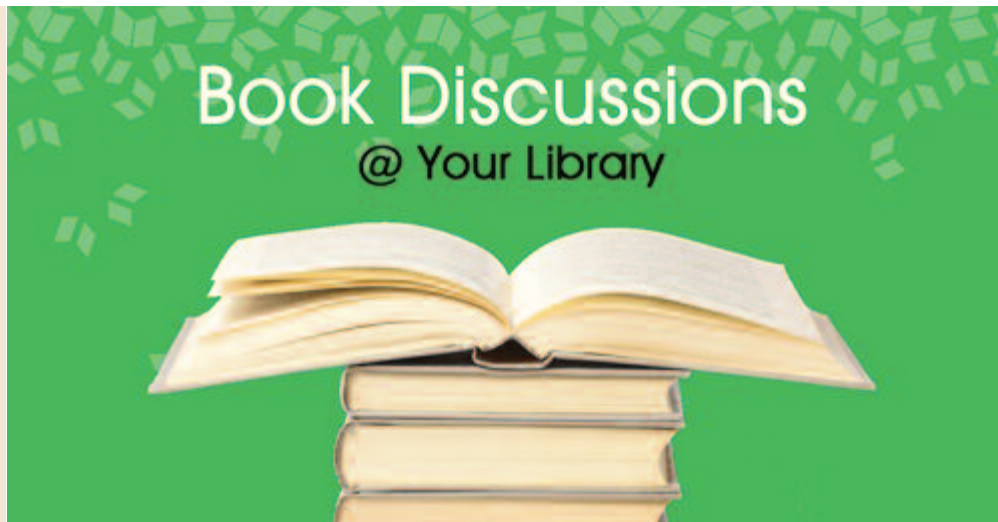
SHIVER ME TIMBERS - IT'S INTERNATIONAL TALK LIKE A PIRATE DAY, SEPTEMBER 19!

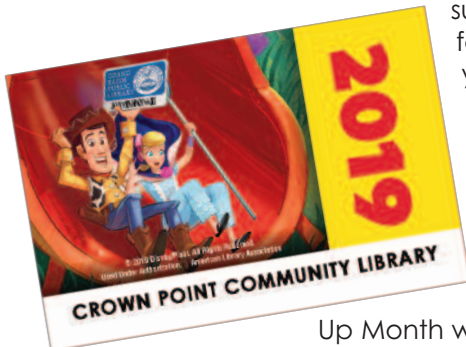

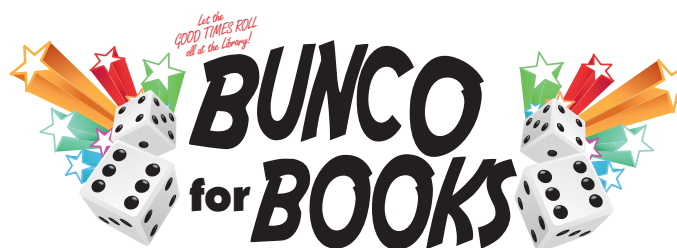

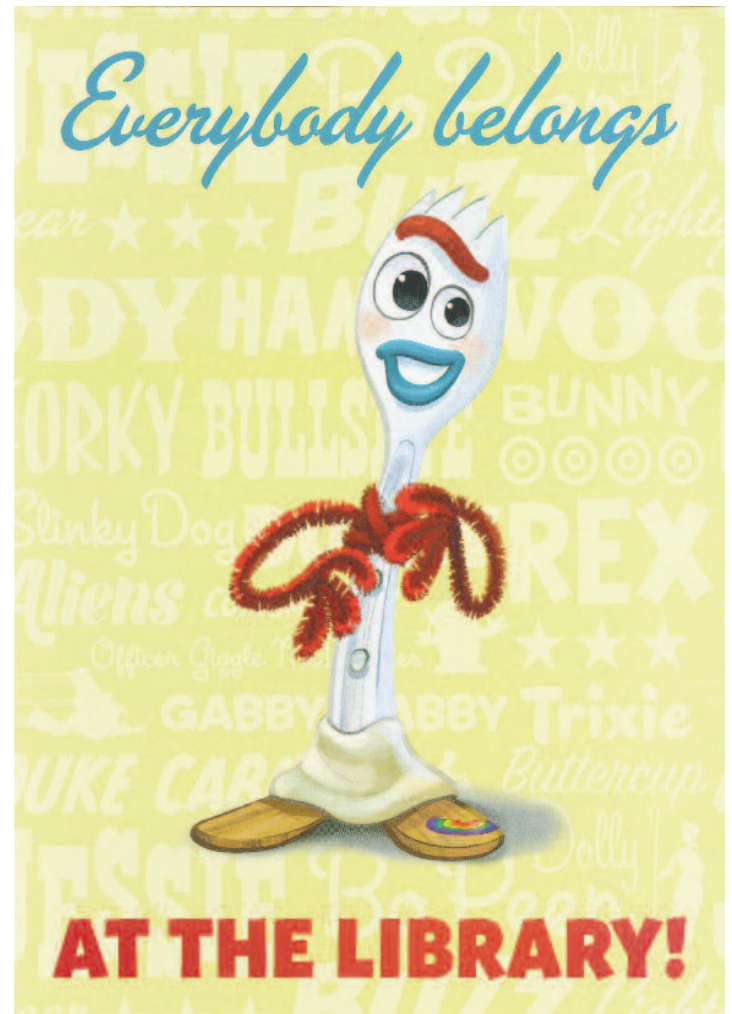

1,000 BOOKS BEFORE KINDERGARTEN



Families are invited to join the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program. The program encourages parents and caregivers to regularly read aloud to their children. By reading just one book a night, families can reach the 1,000-book goal in three years and provide their children essential early literacy skills.

Here is how it works:

- Any child, ages birth to five years, can participate.
- Keep track of the number of books you read to your child on a reading log. Return log periodically and collect rewards.

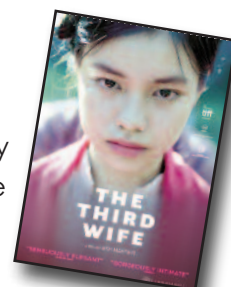
