The display highlights the newest addition to the collection, donated by the Lake County Board of Elections: the 1934 Primary Election Rollbooks, with historical information regarding the 1934 election. Although the display is in a locked case, the books can be made available for viewing upon request. Perhaps you'll find a familiar name if you peruse the books.

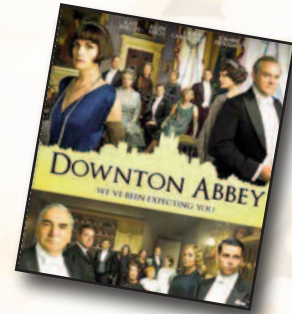

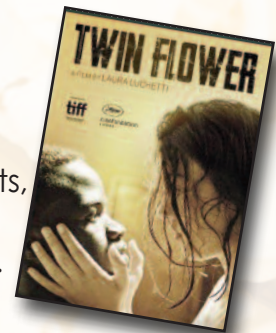

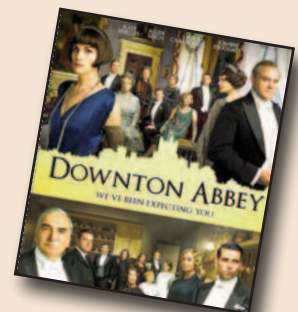
