



For the safety and health of our community, we will be offering virtual programming and take & make activity bags until we can resume in-person programming at the Library.





James H. Madison is the Thomas and Kathryn Miller Professor Emeritus of History at Indiana University. An award winning teacher, Jim is the author of several books, including Eli Lilly: A Life; Slinging Doughnuts for the Boys: An American Woman in World War II; Hoosiers: A New History of Indiana; and A Lynching in the Heartland: Race and Memory in America. Jim's new book is The Ku Klux Klan in the Heartland. The Midwestern History Association recently honored him with the Frederick Jackson Turner Lifetime Achievement Award.



#### About the book (excerpt from Goodreads):

"Who is an American?" asked the Ku Klux Klan. It is a question that echoes as loudly today as it did in the early twentieth century. But who really joined the Klan? Were they "hillbillies, the Great Unteachables" as one journalist put it? It would be comforting to think so, but how then did they become one of the most powerful political forces in our nation's history?

In *The Ku Klux Klan in the Heartland*, renowned historian James H. Madison details the creation and reign of the infamous organization and offers a detailed history of this powerful organization and examines how, through its use of intimidation, religious belief, and the ballot box, the ideals of Klan in the 1920's have on-going implications for America today.
