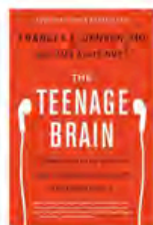

Bringing Up Bébé by Pamela Druckerman explores French parenting techniques, contrasting them with American methods, and highlights how French children learn to sleep through the night, eat diverse foods, and develop self-control through a framework of firm but flexible boundaries, encouraging independence, and allowing parents to maintain their own lives.



Bring the whole family: While parents talk, little ones (ages 0–5) can enjoy toys and coloring in the same room, and children ages 6–12 can take part in activities in the adjacent meeting room.

- Follow the instructions in each BINGO box and mark them off as you complete them.

New Rates (Effective Jan. 1, 2026):

- Not-for-Profit Organizations: No charge (proof of status may be required).
- For-Profit Organizations/Businesses/HOA/POA: \$40 an hour, per room.
- Private Events: \$40 an hour, per room.
- Cleaning Fee: \$50 (if meeting room guidelines are not followed).
- Additional Before/After Hours Use: \$25 an hour (waived for partnership organization programs).
- Payment is due two weeks before the reservation date. Refunds are not issued unless the Library must close or cancel an event; however, credits may be applied to future rentals if the user cancels an event.
