More Than a Game: Community at the Library

For more than a decade, one of the Crown Point Community Library's strongest examples of community-building has been its weekly Mah Jongg program at the Crown Point location. Led by Vicky Klein and Cindy Beckman since 2015, the program introduced many of our community members to the American version of Mah Jongg well before its recent rise in popularity. Over time, it has become much more than a game—it is a welcoming gathering activity where friendships flourish, laughter is shared, and community connections grow.

Public libraries play an important role in addressing senior loneliness, and programs like Mah Jongg demonstrate the meaningful impact of adult programming. Participants return each week not only to play, but to connect with familiar faces, welcome newcomers, and enjoy a supportive, social environment. It is a clear example of the library as a "third place"—a space that fosters belonging and connection.

If you're interested in learning Mah Jongg, we invite you to join us. Beginners can attend the first Monday of each month at 1 p.m. at the Crown Point location, with open play every Thursday at 1 p.m. The Winfield Branch Library also offers Cantonese Mahjong on Wednesdays at 1 p.m., expanding opportunities for participation across our community.

In addition to Mah Jongg, the library offers a wide range of adult programs, including card crafting, knitting, crochet, bunco, cooking, and multiple book clubs. Under the leadership of Head of Information and Engagement Erika Wagner and Winfield Branch Manager Cindy Baumeister, these programs provide ongoing opportunities for adults to connect, learn, and engage at both library locations.

The impact of the library's efforts paired with the power of collaboration is also evident as we partner with the City of Crown Point, the Town of Winfield, the Crown Point Community School Corporation, and local organizations and businesses to expand access to services, support educational achievement, and enhance quality of life. These partnerships not only strengthen our programs but have also earned the library recognition as an award-winning model of community engagement.

At the heart of all we do is a commitment to providing exceptional value. Public libraries deliver a strong return on investment by offering free access to materials, technology, programs, and services. In 2025, the library welcomed 236,168 visits—an increase of nearly 9,000—demonstrating our growing role in the community.

Equally important is our role as a welcoming space for all. We uphold intellectual freedom and work every day to create an inclusive environment where everyone feels a sense of belonging.

During April 19–25, 2026, I invite you to celebrate National Library Week with us. Visit, attend a program, explore our resources, and most importantly, find your library joy. It has been my privilege to serve this community since 2010—and as Director since 2018—focusing on expanding engagement and building meaningful partnerships. The library is more than a place; it is a vital part of what makes Crown Point and Winfield extraordinary communities to live, work, and play.

In the 1950s, comedienne Lucille Ball captured the hearts of television audiences across the nation with her unforgettable humor and boundless energy. Her wacky hijinks and fearless enthusiasm kept millions laughing week after week.

Beyond the spotlight, Ball and her husband, Desi Arnaz, broke new ground in the television industry—founding their own studio and pioneering production techniques that still influence TV today.

But what happens when the beloved on-screen persona doesn't fully reflect the complexities of real life?

In this engaging historical portrayal, historian and actress Leslie Goddard brings Lucy to life, offering a deeper look at both the iconic comedian and the woman behind the legend.

Please note: *This is not a celebrity impersonation or look-alike performance. Instead, it is an entertaining and educational program that explores the life and legacy of Lucille Ball.*

Leslie Goddard is an award-winning actress and scholar presenting history programs for over fifteen years. She holds a Ph.D. from Northwestern University specializing in American studies and U.S. history and a master's degree in theater.

A former museum director, she is the author of three books on history and currently works full-time as an author and public speaker.
