The Calumet region, shaped by generations of community grit and passion, is home to rare ecosystems and monumental steel mills. Learn about the unique relationship between nature, world-class innovation, and artistic expression that makes this region like no other.

In this collaborative three-part series of exhibitions located across the region, local museums, and history centers present their collections and stories. Each exhibition is unique—but all invite visitors to share their voices and become part of the fourth, summative exhibition at the Field Museum.

The Calumet Voices, National Stories exhibition series is a collaborative effort of the Calumet Curators, a group of the Calumet Heritage Partnership, and the Field Museum. This series showcases the rich cultural, industrial, and natural heritage of the Calumet region. The Calumet Heritage Partnership, the Calumet Collaborative, and the Field Museum lead the effort to designate the Calumet region as a National Heritage Area.



Discover an unexpected national treasure located at the southern end of Lake Michigan through the *Calumet Voices, National Stories* exhibition series. The Calumet region, shaped by generations of community grit and passion, is home to rare ecosystems and monumental steel mills. Learn about the unique relationship between nature, world-class innovation, and artistic expression that makes this region like no other.

Experience the life of a steel mill worker. See neighborhoods and nature through the eyes of renowned artists. Learn about the region's natural areas and the people who have fought to protect them. In this collaborative three-part series of exhibitions located across the region, 15 local museums and history centers present their collections and stories. Each exhibition is unique—but all invite visitors to share their voices and become part of the culminating exhibition at the Field Museum.

The second exhibition opened on January 30, 2020, at the **Gary Public Library and Cultural Center, 220 W 5th Ave., Gary, IN 46402**. It will remain on display until June 30, 2020. Partnering organizations (in addition to host site): Cedar Lake Historical Association, Crown Point Community Library, Hammond Public Library, Lakeshore People's Museum, Northwest Indiana Steel Heritage Museum.

Partnering organizations honor the history of Lake County, Indiana, and its contribution to the Calumet Region and the greater national story. It was a collaborative effort to tell the story of this physically and culturally varied county. We chose stories that reflect the greater tale we wanted to convey about Lake County - that these 626 square miles provided, and still provide, an incredible opportunity within its natural wonders for both industry and the people who chose to settle here and call this area home. Please visit the Gary Public Library and Cultural Center to enjoy all the stories the exhibit has to share about this land of natural, industrial, and social opportunities.

Previously on display in the Crown Point Library Lobby, Exercise Your Right to Vote has moved to its permanent location in the Indiana Room. The display highlights the newest addition to the collection, donated by the Lake County Board of Elections: the 1934 Primary Election Rollbooks, with historical information regarding the 1934 election. Although the display is in a locked case, the books can be made available for viewing upon request. Perhaps you'll find a familiar name if you peruse the books.

In 2018, the Crown Point Community Library received a generous donation from the Birdzell Family in memory of local educator, Sharon Greening. The memorial gift was designated to assist with the development and enhancement of the Library's early reading programming and services. The Library had been carefully planning how to utilize

In 2019, in addition to renaming the Crown Point location's Children's Program room in Greening's honor, a portion of the donation was used to purchase a large number of educational materials to support sensory programming for all children, but especially for children with special needs. On January 24, 2020, the Library introduced a new imaginative play area in the Children's Library located at the Crown Point location. The area, designed to have themes that will switch out periodically, will provide an ever-changing learning experience for community children. Some of the planned themes include a grocery store, veterinarian office, diner, farmer's market, post office, science lab, ice cream parlor, bakery, hot dog stand, and pizza shop. The imaginative play materials will also travel to the Winfield Branch Library for use in their imagination play area. The Library's new imaginative play area will become another reason why the Library has become a destination for both learning and fun.
