REOPENING

On Monday, June 15, we reopened our buildings to the public with limited capacity. While we're eager to open our doors to the public, we believe it is important to do our part to prevent a resurgence of COVID-19, and are moving forward with an emphasis on safety and innovation to provide a safe environment for our visitors and staff.

While the Library was closed to the public, we've put into place measures and procedures to ensure the safety for everyone. Below is an outline of some steps we have implemented to keep our community connected to the library:

Despite the closure of physical library branches due to COVID-19, the Crown Point Community Library is still provided services for the community isolated at home. The Library provided the following to accommodate the community's need during the closure:

- Increased online access to the library's digital resources
- Facilitated an online system to process new library cards, updated expired cards or assigned pin numbers for community members.
- Created an eLearning Resource guide to assist schools and teachers.
- Provided outreach materials to senior living centers
- Implemented virtual programming including story time, stem activities, and take & make crafts.
- Offered new online subscriptions: Creativebug, TumbleMath, TeenBook Cloud, and AudioBookCloud.
- Extended free WiFi access to the parking lot areas at both locations.
- Offered one-on-one reference assistance by phone.
- Offered contactless curbside service at both locations.

- Posting safety guidelines at our entrances
- Enhanced cleaning schedule of all high-touch surfaces
- Providing hand sanitizing stations at public desks
- All staff and visitors are encouraged to practice proper hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette
- Social distancing procedures:
 - Maintain at least a six-foot distance between people
 - Acrylic shields and social distancing markers in place at all public service desks
 - Seating will be eliminated/rearranged to support social distancing
 - Requiring all staff to wear masks and strongly encourage visitors to do the same

Altered methods of service for initial reopening:

- Limited service hours
- Library access will be limited to a "Grab'n Go" service, allowing visitors to select materials for immediate check out
- All in-library programming and meeting room reservations remain suspended at this time
- Curbside services will continue through the summer
- Our book drops are open so you can return materials
- Library materials returned will quarantine for 72 hours before checking in and re-shelving, items will remain on patrons record during quarantine, however, no fines will accumulate
- All materials, checked out prior to our March 16 closure are due June 15, fees and fines will be waived through July 1; however, normal charges will begin after that date
- We are not accepting donations at this time

VISITING THE LIBRARY

HOW LONG CAN I STAY IN THE LIBRARY?

- Limited browsing time available.
- "Grab 'n Go" service will allow patrons to visit the library and select materials for immediate check out.
- No-contact curbside holds pick-up will continue to provide access to materials for our most vulnerable members of the community.
- These areas are not available for use at this time: Internet Cafe, Study Rooms, Quiet Room, Meeting Rooms, Indiana Room, Children's Program Room, and Game Room.
- Interactive play areas are temporarily closed.
- Visitors are encouraged to use the self-checkout, stations to minimize contact between patrons and staff.

CAN I USE THE COMPUTERS?

- Yes, limited computers will be available for use.
- Computer session will be limited to 1 hour.
- Disposable plastic coverings are available for keyboard and mouse protections.



ARE VISITORS REQUIRED TO WEAR A MASK?

• While masks are not required to enter library buildings, they are strongly encouraged.

CAN I READ THE NEWSPAPER AND MAGAZINES IN THE BUILDING?

- Newspapers will be available on a table for reading for quick perusal only.
- No chairs will be available.
- All magazines except July issues will be available for check-out.

WHY ARE THE LIBRARY OPERATING HOURS DIFFERENT?

 Like many businesses and organizations, the library lost a number of staff that have decided to not return to work or opted for retirement during the library closure. As a result, the library will need to replace and train staff to cover our service hours. As staffing levels and budgeting allow, the Library will restore hours as we are able.

ARE LIBRARY MATERIALS SAFE TO BORROW?

- Yes! When library items are returned, they will enter quarantine for 72 hours before they can be checked out again. This is the maximum time COVID-19 can survive on a plastic surface (and that is under lab conditions designed to be ideal for the virus; in practice it is likely much shorter). The virus can only survive on paper for 24 hours, but the library is exercising an abundance of caution given the many varieties of materials loaned out.
- After you return an item, it will be three business days before it is checked in. Don't worry about your item(s) becoming overdue during those three days; the library has accounted for the quarantine period in our system and you will not be charged a fine if you return the item on time.
- Quarantining materials is more effective than disinfecting them using chemical, heat, or light treatments. Please do not attempt to heat, bleach, spray, or otherwise sanitize your library materials.

Please wash and sanitize your hands when using shared materials and computers.

SAFETY MEASURES PLAN

CLEANING PROTOCOLS:

FREQUENTLY USED SURFACES

 All frequently touched surfaces will be disinfected multiple times throughout the day.

LIBRARY MATERIALS

 Library materials will be quarantined for 72 hours before being reshelved or requested by another patron.

SOCIAL DISTANCE / PROTECTIVE MEASURES:

- Library staff are required to wear masks
- Library visitors are encouraged to wear masks
- 6 foot social distance will be observed.
- No contact curbside services available
- Sneeze guards placed at public desks
- Limited & spaced seating at the computer lab to ensure social distance

EMPLOYEE HEALTH SCREENING:

 All Library staff are to notify Director if they have any CDC recognized symptoms of COVID-19, and will be asked to remain at home in accordance with CDC guidelines or their healthcare provider.

HAND-WASHING / SANITIZING AVAILABILITY:

- The Library will provide access to multiple restrooms with hand-washing procedure guidelines posted.
- Hand sanitizer & tissues will be made available at public desks.



RETURNING MATERIALS

- Book Drops inside and outside the building are open so you can return materials, but please refrain from handing materials directly to staff.
- Returned library materials will be quarantined for 72 hours before being checked in, as a result items will show on your account for an additional three days after you return them. No fines will accrue during quarantine time.
- All materials checked out prior to library closure are due June 15. Fines will be waived through the month of June, but beginning July 1 fines will be assessed.
- The Library is not accepting donations at this time.



CURBSIDE SERVICE



NO CONTACT CURBSIDE PICK-UP!

On Wednesday, May 20 the Library began offering nocontact curbside pickup for library materials at both locations.

- 1. To request library materials for curbside pickup:
- 2. Place a hold via the library's online catalog or call the Library location by phone.
- 3. Wait until to receive a call from the Library notifying you that your items ar ready for pick-up.
- Pull into a designated curbside pick-up spot, call the Library and notify the staff member of your parking spot number.
- Remain inside your vehicle. Library staff will bring your bagged items out to you and place them on the curbside pick-up sign.

CURBSIDE COMPUTING!


Our Curbside Computing service became available in late May after receiving a grant from the Lake County COVID-19 Response Fund. This Fund was made possible by the support of the Legacy Foundation,

CP Community Foundation, Foundations of East Chicago and the John S. & James L. Knight Foundation Donor Advised Fund at Legacy Foundation.

The mobile carts are equipped with internet access, computer, printer equipped with scanning and copying capabilities. There are two mobile carts at Crown Point and one at Winfield

Now that the library is open, the carts will be available in the Library lobby. They are on a first-come, first-served basis and there is no cost to use any of the features. Please be courteous of your time while others are waiting and practice social distancing. Library staff frequently sanitize the cart surfaces
