If she denies it, Maryam will die. Millions of television viewers are tuning in on the night of Yalda, the Persian celebration of the winter solstice, to see Maryam's fate unfold.

EMATERIALS AT THE LIBRARY

The library will be joining many other libraries throughout Indiana in partnership with the Indiana State Library and OverDrive to create a new collaborative sharing resource to benefit all eMaterial users in the state. This new resource will be called the Indiana Digital Download Consortium.

More information and instructions on this transition can be found on our website and social media. Looking ahead to this change there will be big improvements on access to eMaterials for our patrons.

What will change:

- · A wider selection of materials available
- · Less wait time on holds
- Addition of eAudio
- Addition of eMagazines

What will not change:

- · Access will still require a library card and pin
- Libby app will still be used and is the recommended app
- OverDrive app is being phased out by OverDrive in February of 2022, current app users will be able to continue using it, but OverDrive will be forcing the transition to use the Libby app.
