The Crown Point Community Library's Summer Reading program invited residents of all ages to embark on exciting adventures throughout the summer! From June 1 to July 31, the library offered activities ranging from exploring history and crafting to discovering new recipes, all aimed at making learning fun and engaging for everyone.

Stories in the Park

"Stories in the Park," has become a community favorite and signals that the library's eight-week Summer Reading event has begun. Held weekly at two locations, Bulldog Park in Crown Point and Randolph Street Park in Winfield, this outreach effort extends the library's reach beyond its physical walls. Through partnerships with the Police Department, Fire Department, Post Office, Crown Point School Corporation, and local officials, these storytimes become interactive and educational, fostering community engagement and building positive relationships with public servants.

Music, Movies, and More

Families enjoyed a live music performance with awardwinning author and musician Jim Gill. The summer also featured monthly movie nights at Bulldog Park, where residents could gather to watch family-friendly films under the stars, play games, and enjoy concessions. Both of these events are made possible by the generous donation from our Friends of the Library group.

Library visitors traveled back in time, coming face-to-face with dinosaur models, skeletons, and real fossils at the "I Dig Dinos" exhibit, an interactive and educational experience for all ages.

Summer Reading participants were also treated to free tickets to the July 27th Gary Railcats baseball game when they submitted their reading logs by the end of June. Summer, reading, and baseball—what could be better?

Historical Adventures and Outdoor Exploration

The library celebrated Crown Point's rich history with trolley tours through the historic district and walking tours around the Courthouse. In collaboration with the Lake County Parks and Recreation and grant funding by Indiana Humanities, a special "History Speaks: Civil War Stories" event at Buckley Homestead allowed attendees to experience life in a Civil War camp. Visitors could also view the "Faces of the Civil War" exhibit, at the Crown Point Library's art gallery, on loan from the Indiana Historical Society.

Families gathered at Stony Run County Park to learn about moths through crafts, games, and hands-on activities like making special moth food to paint on trees for these unique nighttime creatures.

In addition, a park ranger visited the library to take attendees on a virtual tour of Indiana Dunes National Park, explaining the park's diverse ecosystems and bringing along interactive items to engage the audience.

Nature enthusiasts signed up for weekly guided walks at Lemon Lake County Park, led by Miss Elizabeth from Gibson Woods Nature Preserve. These nature walks explored different themes each week, offering a deeper connection to the local environment.





Students contributed a bead to their school's jar for every hour of reading. The school with the most beads by July 31 won the Summer Reading trophy. All public and private schools within the Crown Point Community School District, as well as homeschool students in grades K-12, were eligible to participate.

Adventures in Cooking and Crafting

Throughout the summer, the library offered a variety of programs, for all ages, to learn crafting techniques, and make recipes from the library's collection of cookbooks. Programs hosted by Lake County Solid Waste Management's ReUz Room taught participants how to create with recycled materials, compost in their gardens, and even design an edible version of a landfill, blending fun with environmental education.

These activities, along with many, many others, helped make the summer at Crown Point Community Library both fun and educational for all ages.
